THE LONG VERSION:

We don't just make white wines. The truth is we have been nurturing some relationships with great red vineyards for years- it's just that nothing is quick in the wine world. Blau as in blue, Fränk as in French, Isch as in ...well...ish. It has deep potential that will be revealed over time in the bottle.

This Blaufränkisch was grown in Benzie County on the Eden Hill. It is a young vineyard with great promise. Following fermentation the wine was aged in gently used oak barrels for 8 months. Blaufränkisch is an Austrian grape variety that grows very well in Northern Michigan. This wine shows the typical black pepper and blueberry tones the grape is known for. It has similarities to Pinot Noir and Syrah. The light tannins make it unassuming and ready to drink.
