KINGSTON BLACK HARD CIDER

Engle Ridge Farm Grand Traverse County

Kingston Black is a classic English bittersharp cider apple.

This variety is notoriously difficult to grow and we had just about given up on it after eight years without fruit.

However, 2022 miraculously produced a small crop so we had to make a single variety cider from it. We do not know if it will happen again. The cider is dry and tannic with a striking color and phunky taut finish. Great with pungent cheese and salted meats.

These apples were grown among over a dozen other heirloom varieties on the Engle Ridge Farm in Grand Traverse County. Only 56 cases were produced.


