Terminal Moraine Vineyard Old Mission Peninsula

The Terminal Moraine vineyard is a 1.5 acre site grown by the Reehorst family on their home property. The site is named for the land form produced by the glaciers which cut through land to form the Old Mission Peninsula.

As a result of this ancient history, the land has two distinct soil types: a sandy loam top layer atop a layer of clay and gravel. As the taproots of the vines push deeper into the ground, they pull up characteristics from both layers. These two personalities blend to make a structured wine with fat peach and apricot qualities and a stony acid finish.

We have aged this wine for one year prior to its release, and, if you have the patience and willpower to hold on to the bottle, it will continue to evolve for many more years.
